He also tells <i>hugur-un üliger</i> which is a special Horchin Folk Art. <i>Senggerenchin</i> is a narrative song about Senggerenchin (1811–May 19, 1865) a ruling prince of the Banner, general in the late Qing dynasty. He is mainly known for his role during the Second Opium War and the suppression of the Taiping and Nian rebellions. He is now also eulogized as a local hero.
