Recto: *qui condolere possit … secundum ordinem Mechisedech* (Hebrews 5:2-10; most likely for Valentine, priest and martyr); *Apostoli <...> unde supra. Lect E. Beati Petri* (epistle for St Peter's Chair in Rome) <...>*s apostolus Ihesu Christi electis advenis dis- …* ending on verso.

Verso: *In nativitate sancti Mathei. Lect. Actuum apostolorum* ending imperfectly *resurrectionis eius nobiscum* (in the epistle for St Matthias, Acts 1: 15-22).

Once the outer covering of a small book; the verso stained with dirt.

Origin: written in ?Italy.
